

**Growers of  
Bismarck Plant Materials Center  
Grass and Forb Releases  
January 2011**

Following is a list of growers who are producing grass, native forb (wildflower) and legume seed of Bismarck Plant Materials Center (PMC) cooperative releases (cultivars and pre-varietal germplasm).

Those included on the list are growers who have received seed from the PMC, grown it for increase, and are now marketing their seed. Other vendors and seed distributors sell, but do not generally grow Bismarck PMC releases. These wholesalers and retailers are not included on the list, as tracking all of these entities is difficult. All growers included on the list responded to a seed production questionnaire from the Bismarck PMC and agreed to have their contact information listed. The PMC does not guarantee quality or availability of any seed that growers may produce and market. Purchasing certified seed is always advantageous to the buyer. As certification may change from year to year for a field, contact the grower to find out if a specific seed release they are producing is certified.

Cooperators and agencies interested in purchasing seed should make their own contacts regarding availability and price.

## **How to Use the Directory**

Grasses are divided into native and introduced categories and warm and cool-season categories. The forbs are listed in a separate category. Next to each common name are the release names for that species. The designation "Germplasm" or "Ecotype" indicates it is not a cultivar or variety release. The letter number combination to the right of each release name corresponds to grower information on the following page.
